## Joseph P. Gottsacker

Joseph P. Gottsacker, 74, of 1625 N. 10<sup>th</sup> St., well-known Sheboygan printer, died Tuesday evening at St. Nicholas Hospital after a brief illness.

He was born Dec. 16, 1885, in Sheboygan, the son of the late Frank and Anna Gottsacker. He attended Holy Name School and learned the printing trade at an early age under the direction of his father who owned and operated the Democrat Printing Co. He later operated his own firm, the Gottsacker Printing Co. until 1932 when his son-in-law William Orth assumed the operation.

He was married Nov. 25, 1908 to Miss Anna Landgraf at Holy Name Catholic Church. There celebrated their golden wedding anniversary in 1958.
